MAACCE HISTORY

IN 1973-1974, INDIVIDUALS WORKING IN ADULT BASIC EDUCATION AND IN CONTINUING EDUCATION JOINED TO FORM AN ORGANIZATION THEY NAMED THE MISSOURI ASSOCIATION OF ADULT AND CONTINUING EDUCATION (MAACE). IN 1974-1975, INDIVIDUALS WORKING IN COMMUNITY EDUCATION FORMED THE MISSOURI COMMUNITY EDUCATION ASSOCIATION (MCEA).

BOTH ORGANIZATIONS GREW, WERE SUCCESSFUL, HAD OUTSTANDING ACCOMPLISHMENTS, AND WORKED HARD FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE ORGANIZATIONS. IN 1982-1983, MAACE AND MCEA DISCUSSED THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN UMBRELLA ORGANIZATION THROUGH WHICH THEY COULD JOIN TOGETHER WHILE STILL SUPPORTING THEIR INDIVIDUAL INTERESTS. AS A RESULT, THEY FOUNDED THE MISSOURI ASSOCIATION OF ADULT, CONTINUING, AND COMMUNITY EDUCATION (MAACCE) IN 1983-1984. FOUR CATEGORIES WERE INCLUDED IN THE ORGANIZATION: ADULT BASIC EDUCATION, COMMUNITY EDUCATION, BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY, AND HIGHER EDUCATION. BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY HAS BECOME A PART OF COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND IN 2002, THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS WAS ADDED AS A CATEGORY OF MAACCE.

OVER THE PAST 24 YEARS, MAACCE HAS EXPERIENCED A NUMBER OF CHANGES, BUT THE ORGANIZATION CONTINUES TO FLOURISH. A KEY FACTOR IN THE SUCCESS OF MAACCE IS THE WILLINGNESS OF INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS TO OFFER THEIR TIME AND EXPERTISE, TO ACCEPT LEADERSHIP ROLES IN THE ORGANIZATION, AND TO ENCOURAGE OTHERS TO SUPPORT LIFELONG LEARNING.

MAACCE CATEGORY DESCRIPTIONS

CATEGORIES OF MAACCE MEMBERSHIP EXIST TO HELP CREATE AWARENESS OF EACH STRAND'S DUTIES, RESPONSIBILITIES, CHALLENGES AND ACTIVITIES THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. CATEGORY MEMBERS DISCUSS WAYS TO ENSURE THAT PRESENTATIONS ARE OFFERED AT THE ANNUAL MAACCE CONFERENCE THAT ADDRESS THE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT NEEDS OF EACH GROUP.

EACH CATEGORY IS REPRESENTED BY A CHAIR OR CO-CHAIRS. ANNUAL ELECTIONS ARE HELD AT EACH CATEGORY MEETING TO SELECT A NEW CHAIR OR CO-CHAIRS. PLEASE ATTEND YOUR CATEGORY MEETING AND PARTICIPATE TO BE REPRESENTED AT MAACCE.

ADULT EDUCATION & LITERACY DIRECTORS

MEMBERS OF THE AEL DIRECTORS INCLUDE ADULT EDUCATION & LITERACY PROGRAM DIRECTORS AND DESE'S ADULT EDUCATION SECTION STAFF MEMBERS. THIS CATEGORY FOCUSES ON ISSUES RELATED TO THE ADMINISTRATION OF AEL PROGRAMS. THE MISSOURI AEL ADMINISTRATORS' ASSOCIATION (MAELAA) IS A 501(C)(3) ORGANIZATION SUPPORTING AEL INITIATIVES, INCLUDING LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY FOR AEL PROGRAMS AND CONSTITUENTS.

ADULT EDUCATION & LITERACY TEACHERS

MEMBERS OF THE AEL TEACHERS PROVIDE NETWORK OPPORTUNITIES FOR ADULT EDUCATION & LITERACY TEACHERS FROM ALL OVER THE STATE. AEL INCLUDES INSTRUCTIONAL AREAS/TOPICS OF ABE/ASE AND ESL/ELL. TEACHERS PROVIDE INSTRUCTION IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE SKILLS, HSE AND WORKFORCE PREPARATION AS WELL AS COLLEGE TRANSITIONS. ADDITIONALLY, AEL TEACHERS TEACH BASIC ACADEMICS, LIFE AND SOCIAL SKILLS TO THEIR STUDENTS. PARTICIPATION IN MAACCE PROVIDES OPPORTUNITY TO SHARE BEST PRACTICE IDEAS, INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES AND RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT.

HIGHER EDUCATION

MEMBERS OF THE HIGHER EDUCATION CATEGORY MAY INCLUDE INDIVIDUALS FROM PUBLIC/PRIVATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES AROUND THE STATE. MEMBERS ARE FOCUSED ON COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, LIFELONG LEARNING AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. MANY MEMBERS OF THE HIGHER EDUCATION CATEGORY PARTICIPATE IN THE COMMUNITY EDUCATION CATEGORY AS PROGRAMS SIGNIFICANTLY OVERLAP.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY EDUCATION CATEGORY PROVIDE LIFELONG LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES IN THE FORM OF EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS FOR MEMBERS OF A COMMUNITY, INCLUDING ENRICHMENT CLASSES, GENERAL INTEREST, PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT, AND JOB SKILLS TRAINING. MANY PROGRAMS SERVE A CONSTITUENCY OF INDIVIDUALS FROM PRESCHOOL TO SENIOR AGES. PROGRAMS ARE DESIGNED TO MEET THE NEEDS OF A COMMUNITY AND TO FILL A NICHE FOR INDIVIDUALS NOT SEEKING A COLLEGE DEGREE BUT A LEARNING OPPORTUNITY. SOME MEMBERS OF THIS CATEGORY ARE OFTEN FROM COLLEGES OR UNIVERSITY PROGRAMS OR FROM K-12 SYSTEMS—THESE INDIVIDUALS ARE WELCOME TO PARTICIPATE IN EITHER HIGHER EDUCATION OR AFTER SCHOOL CATEGORIES AS WELL.

AFTER SCHOOL

MEMBERS OF THE AFTERSCHOOL CATEGORY PROVIDE AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS TO STUDENTS WITH ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT OPPORTUNITIES DESIGNED TO REINFORCE AND COMPLEMENT THE REGULAR SCHOOL-DAY CURRICULUM DURING HOURS OUTSIDE OF SCHOOL (BEFORE OR AFTER SCHOOL AND DURING THE SUMMER AND HOLIDAYS). THESE PROGRAMS PROVIDE A RANGE OF HIGH-QUALITY SERVICES TO SUPPORT STUDENT LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT, AS WELL AS, KEEP KIDS SAFE AND HELP WORKING FAMILIES. THIS CATEGORY IS OPEN TO TEACHERS, ADMINISTRATORS, AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROFESSIONALS, WHO WORK IN AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS.

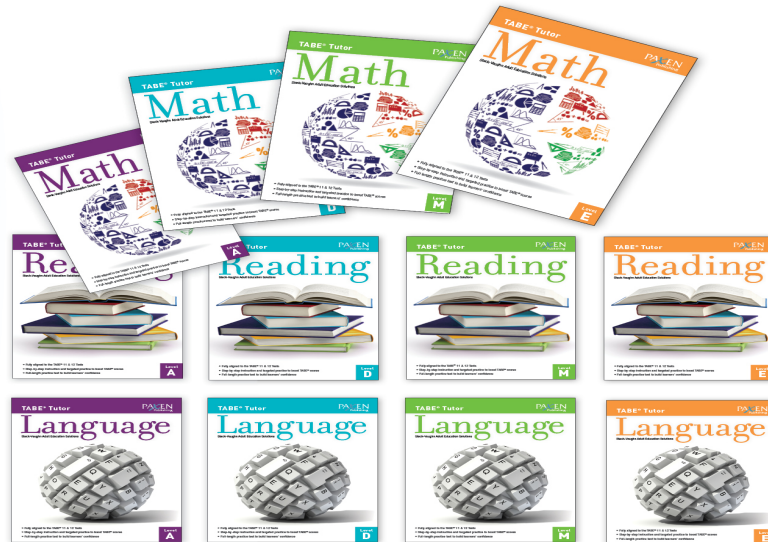


PRESIDENT-ELECT-CHERYLE MARTIN

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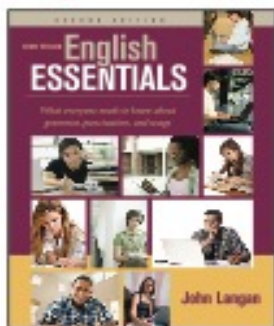
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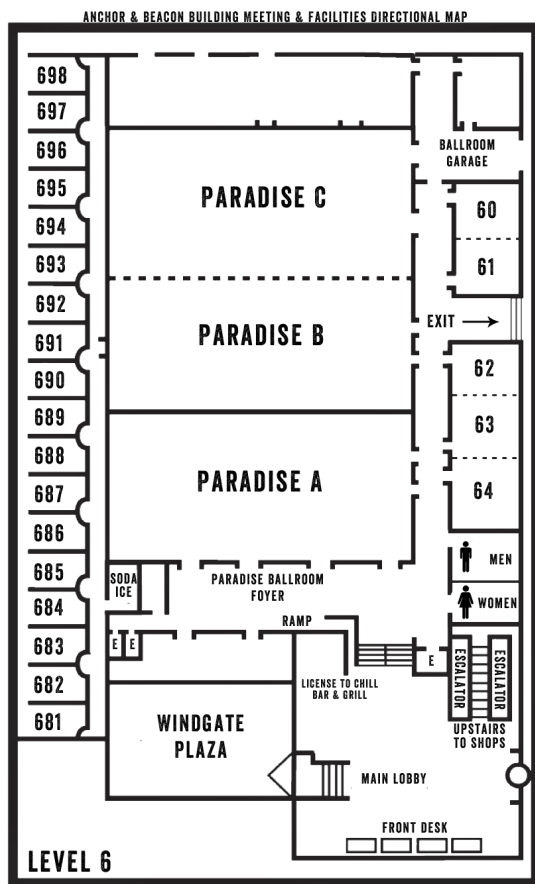
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Beacon Building Meeting Rooms

Compass Rose Ballroom: On the 7th floor of Anchor Building (floor above the Main Lobby) go down the Boardwalk, past all of the shops, down three flights of stairs to the Beacon Building Landing. At the Landing, take the short flight of carpeted stairs going up. The Compass Rose Ballroom is on the left.

Island: On the 7th floor of Anchor Building (floor above the Main Lobby) go down the Boardwalk, past all of the shops, down three flights of stairs to the Beacon Building Landing. At the Landing, take the short flight of tile steps down, go past the entrance of Fin City Bowling. Proceed down the ramp, turn right and go straight ahead into Island.

Escape: On the 7th floor of Anchor Building (floor above the Main Lobby) go down the Boardwalk, past Margaritaville Store. Escape is on the right side of the hallway, across from Wood'n Ya Wanit.

Coral Reef: On the 7th floor of Anchor Building (floor above the Main Lobby) go down the Boardwalk, past Wood'n Ya Wanit. Coral Reef is on the left before Lindee's.

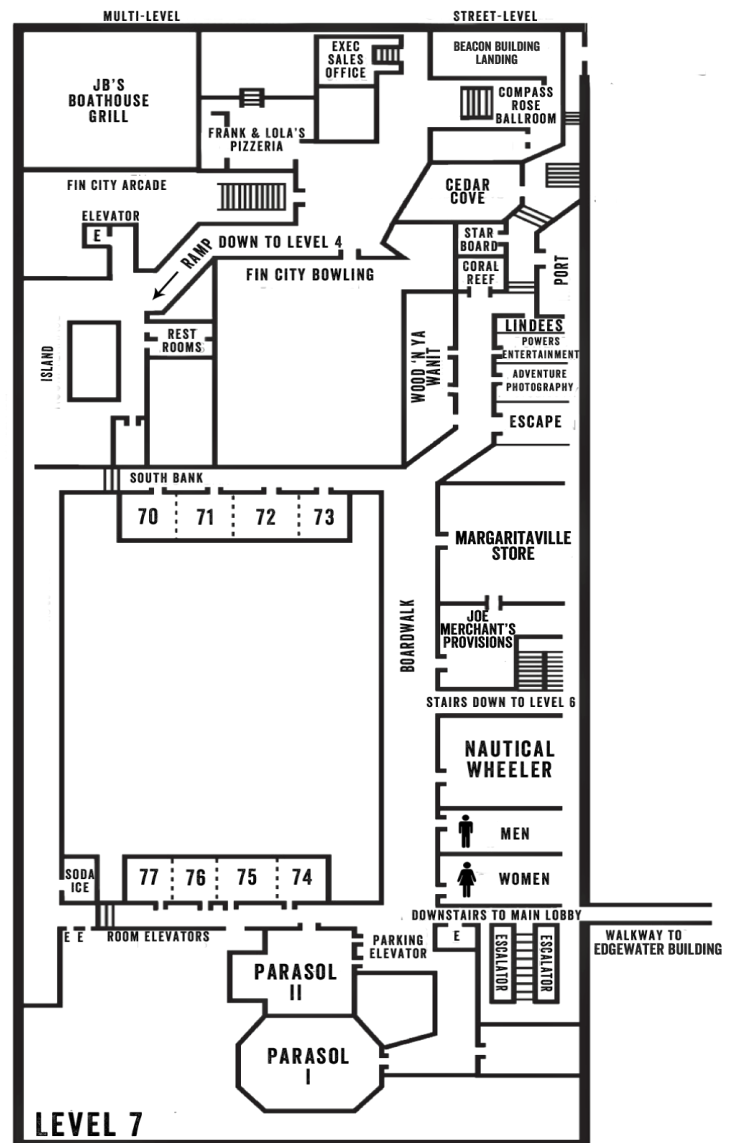
Port: On the 7th floor of Anchor Building (floor above the Main Lobby) go down the Boardwalk, past all of the shops, down the flight of stairs. Port is on the right.
