- Missouri HSE Examination Eligibility Requirements
  - **Residency:** Candidates must be a resident of Missouri to take the HSE exam.
  - Age: Typically, candidates may only take the HSE exam if they are 17 years of age or older. However, if candidates are younger than 17 years of age, they may take the HSE exam if approved by the Missouri HSE Office for an HSE Age Waiver after meeting one of the conditions set by the Missouri State Board of Education.
    - HSE Age Waiver Application can be found at <u>hse.mo.gov</u>.



- Missouri HSE Examination Eligibility Requirements (continued)
  - Test Preparation or Instruction: Missouri does not have any test preparation or instruction requirements to take the initial test at a testing center. However, instruction is encouraged before retesting. \*Note: The GED<sup>®</sup> online proctored exam does have a practice test requirement set by the test publisher.

- Missouri HSE Examination Eligibility Requirements (continued)
  - Identification: Candidates must present identification on test day.
    - Missouri Positive Identification Requirements for the High School Equivalency Examination can be found at <u>hse.mo.gov</u>.
    - With few exceptions, ID documents must
      - be an original document, photocopied documents are not acceptable; and
      - show the test-taker's full name exactly as it appears in the test publisher's system.
    - Outdated or expired IDs will not be accepted.





- Missouri HSE Examination Eligibility Requirements (continued)
  - Acceptable forms of ID include:
    - Permanent or temporary Missouri license (Driver, Nondriver, Intermediate, Commercial or Instruction (learners) permit),
    - U.S. passport or passport card and Missouri address in the test publisher's system as proof of residency,
    - U.S. military ID and Missouri address in the test publisher's system as proof of residency, or
    - Tribal ID and Missouri address in the test publisher's system as proof of residency.
  - Examinees without acceptable ID <u>WILL NOT</u> be permitted to test and will forfeit fees.
  - Identification requirements for online proctored exams may vary.

  - Missouri HSE candidates may combine current-series GED<sup>®</sup> and HiSET<sup>®</sup> subtest scores through DiplomaSender's <u>TotalTranscript</u><sup>™</sup> feature to achieve an HSE credential.
    - Candidates may take subtests for either exam in any order.
    - Passing scores will remain the same, 145 minimum per subtest for GED<sup>®</sup> and a minimum score of 8 and an average of 9 for HiSET<sup>®</sup> (minimum 2 for the essay on HiSET<sup>®</sup> Language Arts Writing).
  - Candidates wishing to utilize the TotalTranscript<sup>™</sup> feature are responsible for paying all fees for both exams, including the state administration fee.

GED<sup>®</sup> Test Score Transfer to Missouri

Once logged in, Test Taker should click the (test taker's) *initials* in the top right corner of the home page, click *Edit Profile* on the drop-down menu, and change their out-of-state address to their current Missouri mailing address.

  - 1. Test Taker must create a separate myHiSET account at <u>HiSET.org</u> with a current Missouri mailing address.

    - a) Student advocate may submit a <u>HiSET Support Form</u>. On the form, select Merge Account Request as the area of need and include the following information in the description field:
      - Full Name as listed in the test taker's HiSET<sup>®</sup> account,
      - Name of State where previous HiSET® exams were completed,
      - Previous State HiSET<sup>®</sup> ID#, and
      - Missouri HiSET<sup>®</sup> ID#.

- b) Test Taker may send an email to <u>hse@dese.mo.gov</u> requesting that out-of-state GED<sup>®</sup> test scores be transferred to Missouri. Include the following test taker information:
  - Full Name as listed in the test taker's HiSET® account,
  - Name of State where previous HiSET® exams were completed,
  - Previous State HiSET<sup>®</sup> ID#, and
  - Missouri HiSET<sup>®</sup> ID#.

### **High School Equivalency Age Waivers**

#### **Age Waiver Application**

Missouri citizens (with a Missouri mailing address) less than 17 years of age interested in taking a state-approved High School Equivalency (HSE) examination at a test center or less than 18 years of age interested in taking a state-approved HSE examination at home/secure location must apply for an age waiver by completing and submitting the **Missouri HSE Test Age Waiver Application**. Requirements for applying for an HSE Age Waiver are listed below under HSE Age Waiver Policy.

Follow these steps to request an age waiver:

- Create an Account: Create a student account for GED d or HISET d. Your GED ID# or your HISET ID# is required to complete the Missouri HSE Test Age Waiver Application.
- Complete the Missouri HSE Test Age Waiver Application: Please read it carefully! If none of the listed conditions in the age waiver apply, you cannot be approved and must wait to test until you are 17 years of age.
- 3. Submit: Submit the Missouri HSE Test Age Waiver Application AND any necessary transcripts to hse@dese.mo.gov 
   or mail to Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, High School Equivalency Office, P.O. Box 480, Jefferson City, MO 65102.

### **HSE Age Waiver Policy**

- Per Missouri HSE Rule 5 CSR 20-200.310, one of the following conditions must be met for an HSE age waiver to be approved. Please note that, by law, these are the only conditions under which an age waiver can be approved. If none of the conditions apply, the student cannot be approved and must wait to test until the age of 17.
  - Be currently enrolled in school and qualify as a participant in an approved Missouri Option Program for at-risk youth;
  - Be withdrawn from school, have successfully completed 16 units of credit toward high school graduation, and have written confirmation of course completion from the superintendent of schools where the most recent high school graduation credits were earned; or
  - If home schooled, have met the requirements of Section 167.031, RSMo for course instruction (including 1,000 hours of instruction) and have written permission of the parent or legal guardian.
- Missouri citizens less than 18 years of age interested in taking the HiSET<sup>®</sup> at home or a secure location must apply for an age waiver due to being a minor and being monitored by an (adult) online proctor. GED<sup>®</sup> test takers less than 18 years of age interested in taking the GED<sup>®</sup> online proctored exam must have a parent or legal guardian available at the beginning of the exam to provide permission for the tester to be monitored by an (adult) online proctor.
- High School Transcript(s): For those applying as a withdrawn high school applicant less than 17 years of age, you must submit a copy of your high school transcript(s) in addition to the application.

#### Does the Missouri HSE Office have a copy of my certificate/transcript?

No, we do not keep any tester documents. If you are looking for a copy of your High School Equivalency certificate/transcript, go to DiplomaSender.com 🗈 and create an account. You can also contact DiplomaSender directly by starting a chat at DiplomaSender.com I or calling 1-855-313-5799.

#### Can I combine GED® and HiSET® subtest scores?

Yes, effective August 1, 2023, Missouri HSE candidates are able to combine current-series GED® and HiSET® subtest scores through DiplomaSender's TotalTranscript II™ feature to achieve an HSE credential. Candidates may take subtests for either exam in any order. Passing scores will remain the same, 145 minimum per subtest for GED® and a minimum score of 8 and an average of 9 for HiSET® (minimum 2 for the essay on HiSET® Language Arts Writing). Candidates wishing to utilize the TotalTranscript<sup>™</sup> feature will be responsible for paying all fees for both exams.

#### How long are my GED<sup>®</sup> and HiSET<sup>®</sup> subtest scores valid?

GED® and HiSET® subtest scores remain valid and do not expire in Missouri until there is a replacement or major re-write of the exam. GED<sup>®</sup> subtest scores prior to January 1, 2014 are no longer valid for use in obtaining a future HSE credential.

### How to Become an Approved Missouri HSE Testing Center

Per Missouri Rule 5 CSR 20-200.310 Administration of High School Equivalence Program, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education approves testing centers to administer any State Board-approved high school equivalency (HSE) examination based on geographic need and testing volume.

Prior to administration of any HSE exam, testing centers must first be approved by the Department and must also meet the requirements of the test publisher for any HSE exams the testing center selects (e.g., the GED<sup>®</sup> or HiSET<sup>®</sup>). Follow these steps to become approved to administer HSE exams:

- Complete the Missouri HSE Testing Center Application and submit site photos: The Department approves and determines need for a new testing site based on geographic location and testing volume in the region.
  - GED<sup>®</sup> Testing Centers I<sup>™</sup>
  - HiSET<sup>®</sup> Testing Centers ₫
- Apply with the test publisher: After your application with the Department has been approved, choose which HSE exam(s) you want to provide and begin the application process with the test publisher. The individual test publishers determine

the ability of a testing center to meet all requirements to administer the selected HSE exam. Requirements vary by test publisher.
