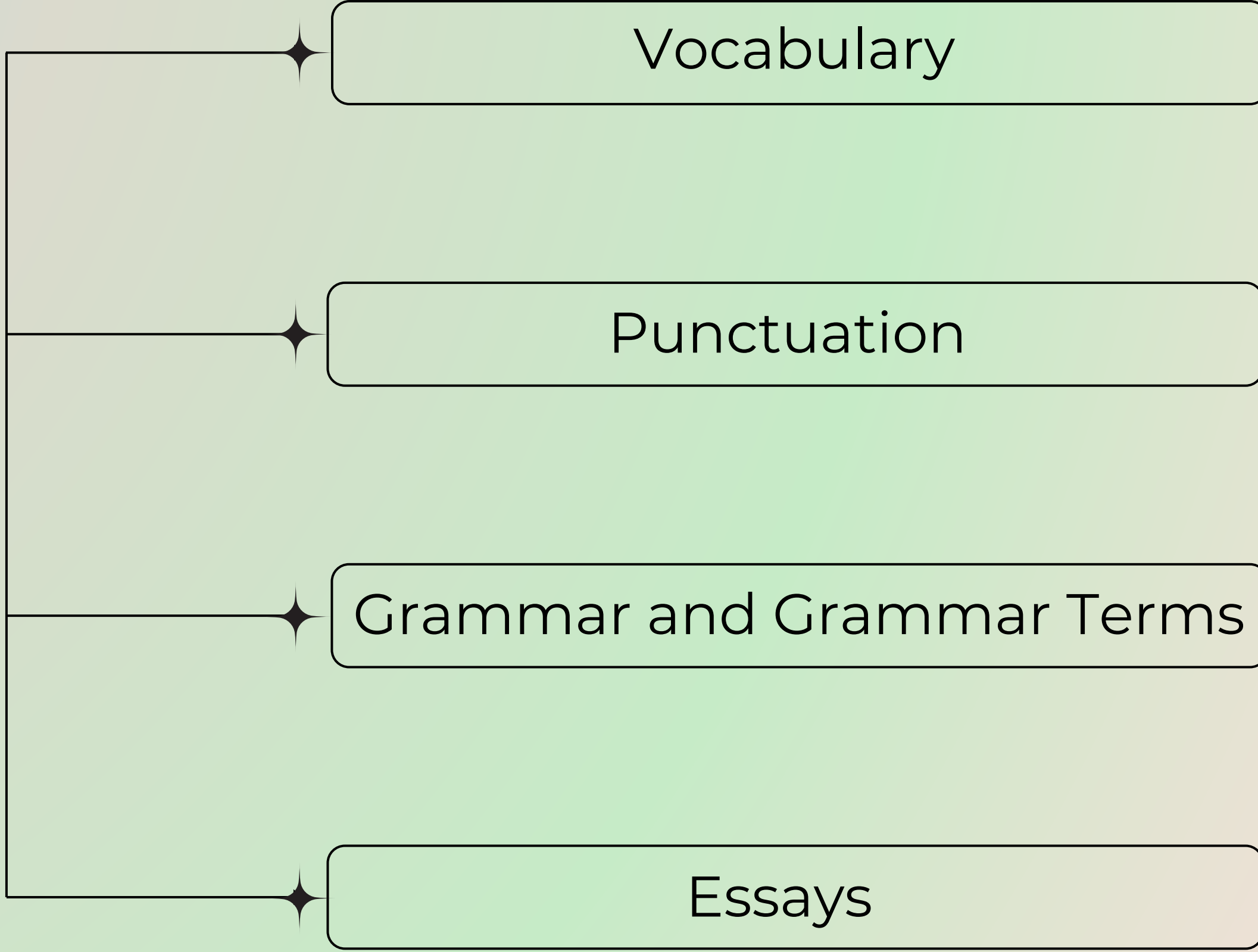

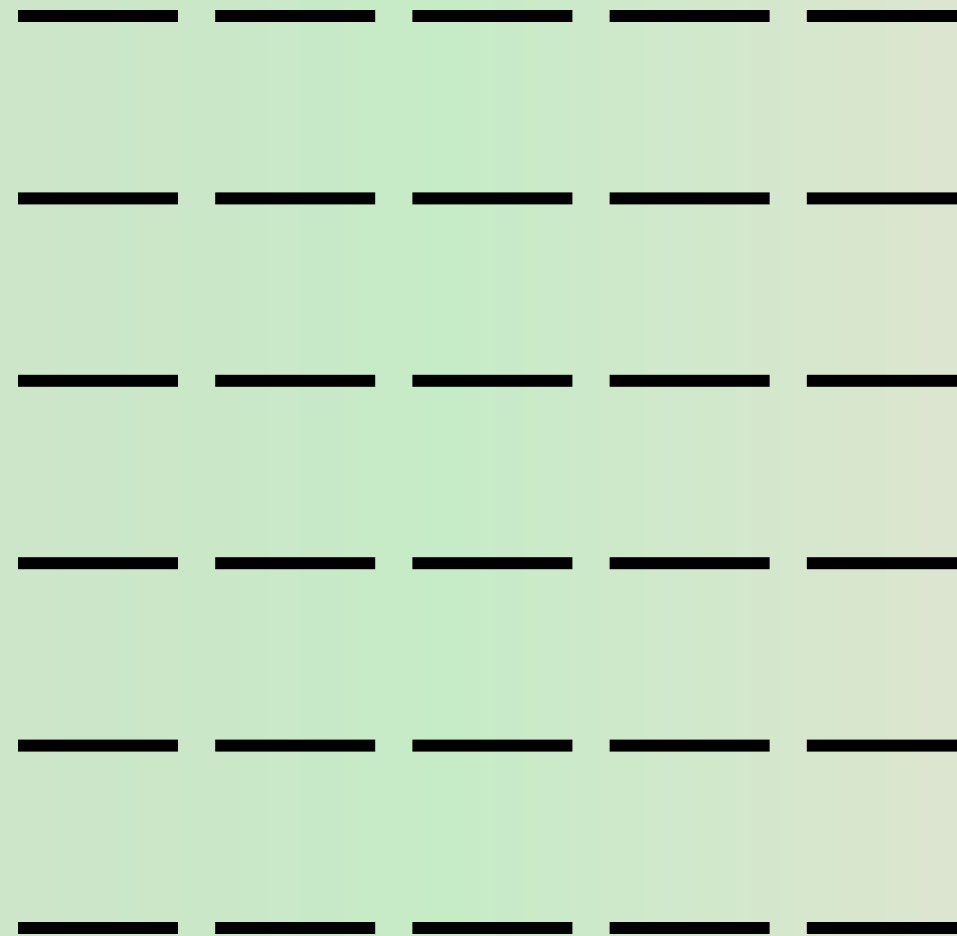

Things to remember:

- ★ Keep it simple and short
- ★ Choose a side and stick with it
- ★ State a personal experience
- ★ Tell how the other side feels and why you don't agree
- ★ Conclude with a restatement of your side
- ★ **Do not plagiarize**

ESSAY OUTLINE 1

There is a lot of discussion about whether... I believe... because... In addition, according to the article,... In my experience,....

On the other hand, there are also strong arguments against this point of view. Opponents believe... I disagree with that because....

After weighing both sides of the debate about ..., it is clear that... because....

ESSAY OUTLINE 2

There is a lot of discussion about whether [A]. I believe [B] because [C]. In addition, [D]. In my experience, [E]. It is for these reasons that I believe [F].

[A] Clearly lay out what the argument is.

[B] Take a firm stance on one side of the issue.

[C] Give one piece of evidence based on information from the reading.

[D] Give a second piece of evidence based on information from the reading.

[E] Give an example of something from your life (true or not) that supports your position.

[F] Wrap it up by restating your position.
